Waste & Recycling Guide 2024 – 2025

FOR RESIDENTS



The City of Perth is working to align with the State's Waste Avoidance and Resource Recovery Strategy 2030 to become a sustainable, low-waste, circular economy in which human health and the environment are protected from the impacts of waste.





Waste and Recycling Targets

Australians send more than 20 million tonnes of waste to landfill every year. We just put things in the bin and the council takes it away. It's out of sight and out of mind. But the amount of waste we generate is a big problem, and it's only getting bigger.

The state government have set a target of 70 percent material recovery (diversion from landfill) by 2025. In the 2022/2023 financial year, the City of Perth recycled 3,951 tonnes of waste and a total recovery rate of 23.05%.

Therefore, it is very important that the City of Perth, together with its residents, businesses, and visitors, aim to minimise waste as much as possible, and utilise all recycling services correctly.

The Waste Hierarchy

The waste hierarchy (please see below) ranks waste management options in order of their environmental desirability. Waste avoidance is the most preferred option and disposal (to landfill) is the least preferred option.



Avoidance

The best way to deal with waste is to prevent it in the first place. Consider what you're buying and use alternatives that don't create waste.

Re-Use

Rather than throwing things away, we should check to see if it can be used again, repaired or repurposed.

Reprocessing

Using materials that would otherwise become waste (such as off-cuts) during the production process.

Recycling

When we recycle something, we convert the item back into raw materials that can be used to create new products.

Energy Recovery

Some waste can be converted into energy, allowing us to recover some of the value of the material used to create it.

Disposal To Landfill

If waste isn't reused, recycled or recovered it ends up in the environment or in landfill

When is my bin collected?

Please see the sticker on the back of your bin for your address and collection day and time (day/night)



For West Perth residents, your general waste (landfill) bin must be out before **4pm**. If your sticker has faded, call City of Perth customer service on 9461 3333.

Loose

Items should always be loose. Bagged items cannot be recycled.





Rinse

Empty and rinse your recyclables to reduce contamination.

Lids off

Remove all lids from bottles and containers.



All Lids to be placed into the General Waste Bin. Eligible Containers for Change lids can be taken to a refund point. Refer to page 9.

Recycling is taken to **Veolia's Material Recovery Facility** (MRF) in Bibra Lake where recyclable materials are separated, baled and then transported to manufacturers for reprocessing into new products including paper, packaging, road base, clothes, carpet, outdoor furniture, appliances and parts for bikes, cars and airplanes.

Residential bulk verge collection

The City of Perth provides two verge collections (March and September) for residents each year. You will be given at least two weeks' notice of the collection date.

This residential verge collection WILL REMOVE:



Whitegoods Stoves, freezers, refrigerators (doors removed), etc



Electronic waste
Televisions, computers, printers,
mobile phones, DVD & CD Players,
VCRs, and Hi-Fi Equipment



Old furniture mattresses



Garden waste
Tree and shrub prunings up to 1.5m in
length and up to 30cm in diameter, lawn
clippings & leaves in boxes or bags

- Place items in separate piles as per above groupings
- · Neatly place items on the street verge
- Items must be able to be lifted by maximum 2 people
- Ensure items do not obstruct the footpath for pedestrians

Some items (including hazardous waste) WILL NOT BE REMOVED during the verge collection.



Construction waste (cement, bricks, rubble, sand)



Tyres + motor oil



Vehicle parts

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)

This waste is hazardous to the environment and should **NOT** be placed in any of your bins! This includes items such as (but not limited to):



Household light alobes and tubes



Printer cartridges



Paint, aerosols & chemicals



Batteries



Gas cylinders



Smoke alarms
