

WHAT IS BOORLOO?

The City of Perth is known as Boorloo to the Whadjuk Nyoongar people — the Traditional Owners of the land on which Perth sits.

Along the Derbarl Yerrigan (Swan River) between Kaarta Koomba (Kings Park) and Matagarup (Heirisson Island) are hunting, camping and sacred places that have provided spiritual and physical sustenance for thousands of years. They are important to generations of Whadjuk Nyoongar people moving along biddi (tracks) between the lakes, coast and hills following the six Nyoongar seasons.

Connections between boodjar (country), moort (families) and katijin (knowledge) still exist in today's Perth. Sharing the importance of these ongoing connections to Whadjuk Nyoongar people is a key aim of the Lotterywest Boorloo Heritage Festival, guided by the City of Perth Elders Advisory Group.

City of Perth Elders

The City of Perth Elders Advisory Group formed in 2018, bringing together ten respected Nyoongar community leaders to guide the City's reconciliation journey.

The Elders are Bridyas (bosses), recognised and valued as heads of the Nyoongar community. They are Ben Taylor, Muriel Bowie, Farley Garlett, Irene McNamara, Albert McNamara, Noel Nannup, Cheryl Phillips, Vivienne Hansen, Gerrard Shaw, and Dot Bynder.

The City of Perth would also like to acknowledge previous Elders Advisory Group members including Walter Eatts and the late Theresa Walley, Doolann Leisha Eatts and Margaret Culbong.

Since 2018, the Elders have generously shared their stories and helped shape the City's understanding of culture and place through initiatives such as the Yacker Danjoo Ngala Bidi (agreement between City of Perth and the representatives of Aboriginal peoples with a connection to Perth) and the redevelopment of Moort-ak Waadiny (Wellington Square).

They have laid the groundwork for moving forward with respect and understanding towards a better future in Boorloo (Perth).

ANNIVERSARIES

We hope you enjoy the exciting mix of walk, talks, tours, performances, open days, open houses, workshops, exhibitions, and events the community of Perth has brought to you as part of the Lotterywest Boorloo Heritage Festival. And it doesn't stop in April – did you know some of Perth's favourite organisations and buildings are celebrating significant birthdays this year? Check out some below!



Department of Fire & Emergency Services (DFES)

The Central Perth Fire Brigade was originally housed in the Perth Town Hall and run mostly by volunteers. The gold rush saw Perth transformed into a bustling town, and in 1899 the newly established WA Fire Brigade Board laid the foundations for the modern, professional fire and rescue service we know today.

Its first headquarters were on Murray and Irwin Streets, a two-storey building, designed by architect Michael Cavanagh and made from Cottesloe limestone. The building was used as Perth's Fire Station until 1979. After it was decommissioned, the station was refurbished and converted into an education centre and museum which is well worth exploring as part of The Lotterywest Boorloo Heritage Festival.



Perth City Farm

An urban permaculture space in the heart of East Perth, this farm has transformed a once contaminated industrial site into an oasis of sustainability.

In 1994, the East Perth
Redevelopment Authority gave the
farm's founders the opportunity to
repurpose the site and make it into
a place promoting environmental
sustainability with arts, culture,
and community engagement.

Since then, Perth City Farm has made some incredible achievements, including gaining organic certification and launching the Saturday Farmer's Market — the first WA market to provide only certified organic and biodynamic produce.



Country Women's Association (CWA) WA

Who doesn't know, and love, the CWA WA? Founded in 1924, the CWA WA have given much needed support to rural families in Western Australia and have been instrumental in promoting women's unity and community cohesion over its long and proud history.

In 1936 the CWA first published the CWA Cookery Book and Household Hints, now in its 58th edition. The cook book has been passed down within families and its recipes have been the 'glue' of social interaction in rural and regional communities across WA.

Initially headquartered in various locations across the city, the CWA WA moved to its current premises on Hay Street in 1968. In the 1960s the CWA was fundamental in the funding and resourcing of the Pioneer Women's Memorial in Kings Park.



His Majesty's Theatre

Considered the grandest Federation Free Classical theatre building in Australia, His Majesty's is marking its 120th year of bringing live theatre, ballet and international and local performers to Western Australians. That's something worth celebrating.

From 21-28 April, His Majesty's Theatre will host an immersive light experience and display featuring the photographs and films capturing this building's incredible history. More free activities are planned for the King Street heritage precinct and laneways surrounding the Theatre.



Perth Mint

WA's early gold rush brought unprecedented prosperity to our State and transformed Perth into a bustling city.

This heritage listed building, completed in 1899, is home to Australia's largest precious metals enterprise and is one of our State's biggest exporters. Last year alone, the Mint crafted more than 19 million coins and other minted products from gold, silver, and platinum.
