

CEO's Determination Employee Gifts Threshold

Regulation 19AF(1) of the Local Government (Administration) Regulations 1996 Integrity at the City of Perth, the Code of Conduct for Employees.

I, Michelle Reynolds, Chief Executive Officer of the City of Perth, determine under Regulation 19AF of the *Local Government (Administration) Regulations 1996* that the threshold amount for a prohibited gift is \$0, subject to the following exemptions:

- 1. **Professional Development**: participation in a professional development opportunity provided by an associated person is permitted if:
 - a. the professional development opportunity has been approved in accordance with the relevant City policies and procedure, and
 - b. the financial value of the professional development opportunity does not exceed \$300.
- 2. **Token hospitality**: the receipt of tea, coffee, or similar minor refreshments offered during a business meeting or similar event is permitted.
- 3. **Conduct money:** money provided by an associated person for the sole purpose of travel to court in response to a subpoena or other summons ('conduct money') is a 'travel contribution' under section 5.57 of the *Local Government Act 1995*. Receipt of conduct money from an associated person is permitted if the conduct money amount is less than \$300.
- 4. **CEO exemption**: in all other circumstances that do not fall within the above categories, I may approve an exemption for the employee to accept the gift, if the following conditions are met:
 - a. the financial value of the gift does not exceed \$300, and
 - b. it can be clearly demonstrated that it is in the public interest that the employee accepts the gift,
 - c. it is unlikely that this gift will cause a conflict of interest in discretionary decision making to arise between the employee and the associated person, and
 - d. having considered a recommendation from Corporate Governance in respect of the proposed exemption.

For the avoidance of doubt, this means that other than the four exemptions above, no gifts are acceptable from a person:

- a. who is seeking or is likely to seek an approval from the City; or
- b. who is engaged in or seeking to engage in, or likely to seek to engage in commercial dealings with the City.



Examples of these persons include:

- a. A supplier or tenderer.
- b. A developer or builder.
- c. An organisation that is seeking or has received sponsorship or events approvals.
- d. A candidate for employment.
